

Car Rally On Sunday

The Sarnia-Huron Auto Sport Association and the Blue Water Sports Car Club of Port Huron will stage their first internation-

al rally next Sunday.

The rally will start at the park at Courtright at 1:30 p.m. (DST). There will be a driver's meeting at 1:15 p.m.

There will be two legs on the Canadian side of the river totallying some 60 miles and two legs on the U.S. side of the river covering a lesser distance There will be one class only and all roads covered will not be paved but will be hard surfaced. The finish will be north of Port Huron on the lake shore.

Treasurer / Membership Business - Ray Scott

- Ray sent a report, which was read in his absence. \$2107 is in the bank. The city is now requiring a cheque for \$1000 as a damage deposit, which is returned if there is no damage. This is in addition to the \$500 that the club has committed to spend on the expenses of the car show. As treasurer, Ray has expressed concern regarding the potential expenditure of that proportion of our resources.
